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PREPARE

Be prepared for a call about your coverage benefits

You will receive a call from either your ILUMYA SUPPORT® team or your specialty pharmacy. They will let you know when your prescription will be delivered to your dermatologist's office. Knowing this will help you to schedule your first treatment appointment.

Once your prescription has been processed by ILUMYA SUPPORT® or the specialty pharmacy, they will send your ILUMYA® (tildrakizumab-asmn) treatment to your dermatologist's office.

SCHEDULE

Make an appointment for your first dose of ILUMYA®

Schedule an appointment with your dermatologist to receive your first dose of ILUMYA® (tildrakizumab-asmn). With personalized support from ILUMYA SUPPORT Lighting the Way®, scheduling your treatment appointments couldn't be easier. Text the date of your first treatment to receive your personalized dosing schedule. Because ILUMYA® is a biologic medicine that is injected in the office by a medical professional, it is covered by Medicare Part B as a medical benefit.



Before your visit, check with your dermatologist's office to see if your medicine has arrived.

Text the date (MM/DD) of your first dose of ILUMYA® to 20808, and we will send you a text message with your personalized dosing schedule for the first year.

HOW ILUMYA® IS GIVEN

You will receive ILUMYA® (tildrakizumab-asmn) just 4 times a year after 2 starter doses.

- Your healthcare provider will give you ILUMYA®
- ILUMYA® will be given as an injection under the skin, in your thigh, stomach area, or upper arm

CLEARER AFTER 2 DOSES



6 out of 10 people were clear or almost clear in as little as **12 weeks** (after just 2 doses).

1 YEAR AND COUNTING



8 out of 10 people who had 75% clearer skin with ILUMYA® at 7 months were still clearer after **1 year** of treatment.

STILL GOING STRONG AT 5 YEARS



9 out of 10 people who achieved clear or almost clear skin after 1 year were still seeing results **5 years into treatment**.

A SAFETY PROFILE WE'RE PROUD OF

When choosing a treatment, it's important to consider the potential benefits and side effects.

Across 3 clinical studies, the rates of serious infection were the same for those taking ILUMYA® (tildrakizumab-asmn) and those who were given an injection without medicine in it (0.3%). The most common ($\geq 1\%$) adverse reactions for ILUMYA® compared to placebo are upper respiratory infections (14% vs 12%), injection site reactions (3% vs 2%), and diarrhea (2% vs 1%).

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What is ILUMYA?

ILUMYA® (tildrakizumab-asmn) is a prescription medicine used to treat adults with moderate to severe plaque psoriasis who may benefit from taking injections, pills (systemic therapy), or phototherapy (treatment using ultraviolet or UV light).

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

What is the most important information I should know about ILUMYA?

Do not use ILUMYA if you have had a severe allergic reaction to ILUMYA or any of its ingredients.

Get emergency medical help right away if you get any of the following symptoms of a serious allergic reaction:

- feel faint
- trouble breathing or throat tightness
- swelling of your face, eyelids, lips, mouth, tongue or throat
- chest tightness
- skin rash

ILUMYA is a medicine that may lower the ability of your immune system to fight infections and may increase your risk of infections. Your healthcare provider should check you for infections and tuberculosis (TB) before starting treatment with ILUMYA and may treat you for TB before you begin treatment with ILUMYA if you have a history of TB or have active TB. Your healthcare provider should watch you closely for signs and symptoms of TB during and after treatment with ILUMYA.

Tell your healthcare provider right away if you have an infection or have symptoms of an infection, including:

- fever, sweats, or chills
- muscle aches
- weight loss
- cough
- warm, red, or painful skin or sores on your body different from your psoriasis
- diarrhea or stomach pain
- shortness of breath
- burning when you urinate or urinating more often than normal
- blood in your phlegm (mucus)

Before receiving ILUMYA, tell your healthcare provider about all of your medical conditions, including if you:

- have any of the conditions or symptoms listed in the section “**What is the most important information I should know about ILUMYA?**”
- have an infection that does not go away or that keeps coming back
- have TB or have been in close contact with someone with TB
- recently received or are scheduled to receive a vaccine (immunization). You should avoid receiving live vaccines during treatment with ILUMYA.
- are pregnant or plan to become pregnant. It is not known if ILUMYA can harm your unborn baby.
- are breastfeeding or plan to breastfeed. It is not known if ILUMYA passes into your breast milk.

Tell your healthcare provider about all the medicines you take, including prescription and over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements.

It is not known if ILUMYA is safe and effective in children under 18 years of age.

What are the possible side effects of ILUMYA?

ILUMYA may cause serious side effects. See “What is the most important information I should know about ILUMYA?”

The most common side effects of ILUMYA include: upper respiratory infections, injection site reactions and diarrhea. These are not all of the possible side effects of ILUMYA. Call your doctor for medical advice about side effects.
