What is ILUMYA?

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION What is the most important information I should know about ILUMYA? Do not use ILUMYA if you have had a severe allergic reaction to ILUMYA or any of its ingredients.

Tell your healthcare provider about all the medicines you take, including prescription and over-the-counter
